

Overview of Research Productivity in the Department of Political Science

In recent years faculty members in Political Science have published (or have forthcoming) a total of 10 books, 3 edited volumes, 138 articles in refereed academic journals, and 28 chapters in edited volumes. This does not include book reviews, popular press articles, encyclopedia entries, technical reports, and other public facing articles. The faculty also present their findings regularly at academic conferences around the country (usually about 40-45 papers a year).

Faculty publish their books and edited volumes with highly respected university presses including Cambridge University Press, the University of Chicago Press, and Oxford University Press. Articles appear in some of the discipline's top-ranked peer-reviewed journals that have low rates of acceptance.

Faculty members are proposing research grants and receiving nationally competitive awards from the National Science Foundation, the Carnegie Corporation, the Russell Sage Foundation, and the Smith Richardson Foundation as well as from state-level agencies such as the Louisiana Board of Regents. Since 2017, the department has proposed 46 projects worth over \$2.5 million and has been awarded 27 grants worth nearly three-quarters of a million dollars.
