THREE GOALS

LSU Vet Med will:

Educate students to become future veterinary, biomedical, and One Health leaders prepared for lifelong learning

Our students are the reason we exist as an academic institution; they shape everything we do. We will employ modern educational practices that embrace interactive and experiential learning in veterinary and biomedical science rooted in One Health. We will teach in world-class learning spaces. We will inspire, challenge, and develop our students into lifelong learners who address societal needs and better lives. We will encourage them to grow in both technical and interpersonal domains of knowledge that promote professional efficacy, incorporating communication skills, cultural sensitivity, financial literacy, and well-being. We will expose them to outstanding clinical services and cutting-edge research. We will prepare them for the challenges of a turbulent world, able to think and act decisively and tactfully to effect change for good.

Deliver research breakthroughs that transform animal and human health outcomes

Research is the engine of our scholarship; it is of foundational importance to our academic mission. We will create knowledge to advance animal and human health by conducting hypothesis-driven, peer-reviewed, extramurally funded research in specific areas of unmet need that are important to Louisiana and the world. Our areas of research concentration will be lung biology and disease, neuroscience, cancer, and infectious disease. Our veterinary clinical scholarship will focus on wildlife health and medicine, orthopedic science and stem cells, laminitis and sepsis, veterinary artificial intelligence (AI), and gastrointestinal health and the microbiome. We will create a research ecosystem embracing team science and impactful collaborations between preclinical and clinical scientists.

Lead One Health and disease preparedness across Louisiana and the world

The interconnected nature of animal, human, and environmental health calls for cross-species expertise in a world threatened by the geographical spread of pathogens, future pandemics, and environmental pollution. We will innovate to offer cutting-edge diagnostic tests and One Health expertise to safeguard the health of all Louisianans and world citizens, helping to control and predict animal disease and its potential spread to people. We will educate future leaders in disease resilience and pandemic preparedness.



FIVE ACTIONS

Our goals will be realized through five actions that frame specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-bound tactics benchmarked against discrete key performance indicators that will be achieved by 2030 or before. We will remove points of friction to facilitate and promote transformational advances in our teaching, research, clinical enterprise, diagnostic services, and institutional capacity, placing our people, our clients, and our Louisiana at the center of everything we do. We will aspire to have global impact and visibility, shaping our world to improve health, increase prosperity, and promote sustainability.

- Transform veterinary and graduate education to foster leadership and career readiness
- Accelerate research and innovation to advance animal and human health
- Expand and strengthen clinical services to drive impact and fiscal sustainability

2 RESEARCH & INNOVATION

Tactic: Create internal ecosystem for research success through interdisciplinary team science and recruit outstanding new faculty talent

Tactic: Gain international distinction in focused areas of veterinary research: wildlife health and medicine, orthopedic science and stem cells, laminitis and sepsis, veterinary AI, and gastrointestinal health and the microbiome

Tactic: Renew Lung Centers of Biomedical Research Excellence (COBRE) grant into Phase 3 and Cancer COBRE into Phase 2

Tactic: Develop extramurally funded Centers of Biomedical Neuroscience, and Drug Design & Development

KPIs

- Increase proportion of research-active clinical faculty with preclinical faculty collaborations that yield grant submissions and publications to >50%
- Enroll a total of 90 PhD students, >50% representing national talent
- Increase extramural award expenditures to \$30M/year
- Secure one or more extramural grants or clinical trials cumulatively worth >\$100,000 in each of the veterinary clinical research themes at all times and publish at least four papers/year in each theme
- Double peer-reviewed citations/year to 400
- Recruit at least six Tenure track or tenured faculty in areas of research focus: lung biology, neuroscience, cancer, infectious disease, veterinary clinical science

- Break ground on Wildlife Hospital of Louisiana and Center for Equine Health & Sports Performance

Tactic: Manage diagnostic enterprise with a focus on exceeding client expectations, including state agricultural entities

Tactic: Strengthen areas of distinction and develop national and global acclaim for expertise in zoonotic disease, pandemic preparedness, and disease response

KPIs

- Receive positive feedback from clients in >80% of spontaneous comments or at least one performance survey per year
- Reach and maintain positive operating margin
- Be nationally and globally recognized for pathology, immunohistochemistry, and molecular diagnostics in all species, as assessed by a 10% increase in caseload each year and annual presentations delivered at national and international conferences and symposia
- Develop a public-facing online presence and monthly newsletter highlighting points of distinction, expertise, and excellence
